



Salmonberry FAQ's

1. How old does my child need to be to attend Camp Keystone?

Half day Camp Keystone is offered for campers 3-6 years old, or entering preschool or kindergarten in the fall. Full day Camp Keystone is offered for campers 5-6 years old, or entering kindergarten or first grade in the fall. Camp Keystone is licensed through the Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) for youth ages 3-6 only.

2. Does my child need to be potty trained?

Yes. Your child needs to be potty trained. We will have access to bathrooms on site to use throughout camp.

3. How many campers are in each group? What is the adult to camper ratio?

Half day groups will have a maximum of 10 campers with 2 adults for a ratio of 1:5 adult to camper. The full day group will have a maximum of 12 campers with 2 adults for a ratio of 1:6 adult to camper.

4. What is the minimum number of campers required to run a camp?

6 campers are required to run each week of camp. If this number is not met two weeks in advance of the camp starting, we will either cancel it and transfer your registration to a different week, or refund you in full.

5. Is there a minimum number of weeks of camps I need to register for?

No. You can register for 1 week of camp or the entire summer!

6. Do you offer a waitlist for full camps?

Yes! If a camp is full, you can still register for it and will be placed on a waitlist.

7. Do you offer scholarships to attend camp?

Yes! As a licensed, outdoor nature-based camp through Washington Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF), subsidies are available to qualifying families. For more information, click [here](#).

8. What is your cancellation policy?

Cancellations must be made at least two weeks prior to the camp's start date. We can move you to a different week, as space allows, or refund your registration (minus the 10% non-refundable deposit). Cancellations made less than two weeks prior to the camp's start date will result in no refund.

9. Where is Camp Keystone located?

Camp Keystone is located on NSEA's campus at 3057 E. Bakerview Rd., Bellingham, WA. Drop off and pick up will take place there.

For each half day group, we will be taking campers on a field trip once per week to a private property located close to NSEA and situated along Tenmile Creek.

For the full day group, we will be taking campers on a field trip every day to the private property along Tenmile Creek, along with other locations throughout Whatcom County.

10. Can I attend Camp Keystone with my camper(s)?

No. Camp Keystone is an opportunity for your camper to spend time outdoors in a safe, enriching environment with other campers to develop skills in self-awareness, teamwork, and social-emotional learning.

11. What does a typical day of camp look like?

No two days are alike at Camp Keystone, but this sample schedule gives you an idea of activity types and daily flow. Lessons will be a mix of outdoor exploration, nature games, stories, arts and crafts, and unstructured play.
