A HIKE IN THE FOREST

On our field trip this week, we explored the forest along Tenmile Creek! We marveled at how big the leaves of skunk cabbage are, and got to see clown millipedes looking for a cozy place to take a nap. We learned that some animals, like salmon, use camouflage to blend in with their habitats and played our own version of a camouflage game. We also looked for signs of animals - ask your camper if they saw, or maybe heard, any signs of animals while investigating in the forest on their field trip.
